

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# Overview

The Sturgeon School Division PowerSchool Parent Portal is an online tool that helps parents be informed and involved partners in education. The Parent Portal gives the very latest information:







# Academic Achievement Scale Kindergarten

At the Kindergarten level, the Academic Achievement Scale is used to communicate student achievement in all learning areas: Early Literacy, Early Numeracy, Citizenship and Identity, Environmental and Community Awareness, Creative Expression, Physical Skills & Well-being, and Personal & Social Responsibility.

#### **Academic Achievement Scale**

Student level of achievement and understanding with reference to the learner outcomes:

- The student consistently demonstrates the skill.
- 3 Skill is emerging and the student requires minimal support.
- 2 Skill is emerging and the student requires direct support.
- Skill requires further development.
- N/A Outcome has not been assessed.

- 1 Student is experiencing difficulty meeting the learner outcomes.





- **Excellent.** The student demonstrates excellent responsibility and independence turning in all assignments, and takes initiative for his/her learning.
- Competent. The student demonstrates satisfactory responsibility and independence by turning in most assignments, and is usually ready to work and learn.
- **Needs Improvement.** The student has assignments missing, or is frequently not ready to work and learn.

### **Work Ethic Scale**


- **Excellent**. The student demonstrates excellent responsibility and independence turning in all assignments, and takes initiative for his/her learning.






The Standards Grades view provides information about a child's progress in relation to the general outcomes identified in the Alberta Programs of Study and Growth as a Learner behaviours.

The Grades and Attendance view provides information regarding a child's courses, attendance, and overall grades for the current school year.






## **Teacher Comments**
