












- Transportation online applications for the 2022-2023 school year can be completed at any time as we have a field which indicates their requested start date for transportation services. Applications can be submitted up to August 5th, 2022 with bus service on the first day of school to allows us to design the routes based on the registration received to date. Applications submitted after that date will be processed as quickly as possible to get services started.
- Students who are returning but have changes in their transportation information such as pickup/drop off locations or contact information will need to complete a new transportation online application.
- There will be new bus passes for the 2022-2023 school year. These will be sent to the school location for distribution in the first weeks of classes. Fees must be paid, or a payment plan in place to receive their bus pass.

The Bus Status App





You want to stay on top of any busing delays or cancellations, and we want you to, too. Sturgeon Public Schools uses the Box Clever Bus Status App to give parents and caregivers a simple and accessible way to make sure they're notified of any changes in the status of their students' bus routes immediately. The app is available on the App Store for Apple devices and the **Google Play Store** for Android devices. iPhone users must be running iOS version 11.0 or later to use the app properly.

The Bus Status App allows you to keep track of any busing delays or cancellations, and receive push notifications for just the bus routes that matter to you.




