Second Languages update January February 2022




Replacement Bus Pass requests can now be submitted online

Once a replacement pass is issued, the old pass will be deactivated.

- Students who were registered in the 2021-2022 school year and have no changes to their transportation information and wish to continue transportation services **will not** be required to re-register for next school year.
- Transportation online applications for the 2022-2023 school year can be completed at any time as we have a field which indicates their requested start date for transportation services. Applications can be submitted up to August 5th, 2022 with bus service on the first day of school to allows us to design the routes based on the registration received to date. Applications submitted after that date will be processed as quickly as possible to get services started.
- Students who are returning but have changes in their transportation information such as pickup/drop off locations or contact information will need to complete a new transportation online application.
- There will be new bus passes for the 2022-2023 school year. These will be sent to the school location
 for distribution in the first weeks of classes. Fees must be paid, or a payment plan in place to receive
 their bus pass.


