AWARDS

GOVERNOR GENERAL ACADEMIC MEDAL

The Governor General's Academic Medal was first awarded in 1873 by the Earl of Dufferin, and has since become one of the most prestigious awards that a student in a Canadian educational institution may receive. This medal is awarded to a grade 12 student who earned the highest overall average during their grade 11 and grade 12 years.

STURGEON RURAL CRIME WATCH AWARD

This award is presented to a student that is involved in the community and volunteering.

REECE REAVILLE

ROTARY AWARD OF MERIT

This award recognizes a grade 11 or 12 student for services to their community and school through strong leadership and academic achievement.

MARK INKSTER

MERIT CONSTRUCTION AWARD

The purpose of this award is to encourage students to achieve excellence in construction-related courses offered in Alberta's high schools. To qualify for this award, a student must achieve top standing in a grade twelve construction-related class, demonstrate high interest in construction CTS courses, exhibit leadership qualities in the classroom, and display a cooperative attitude with fellow students and teachers. This award is sponsored by Merit Contractors Association.

DYLAN KOSTIW

ALICE KLASSEN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is awarded to a student who has been a member of the SCHS Concert Band, Choir, Jazz Band or Small Vocal Ensemble for at least two years. The scholarship was created by Alice Klassen in 1987 to be presented to a student who shows great dedication to the SCHS Music Department. The successful candidate must be enrolled in any post-secondary study within 15 months of graduation.

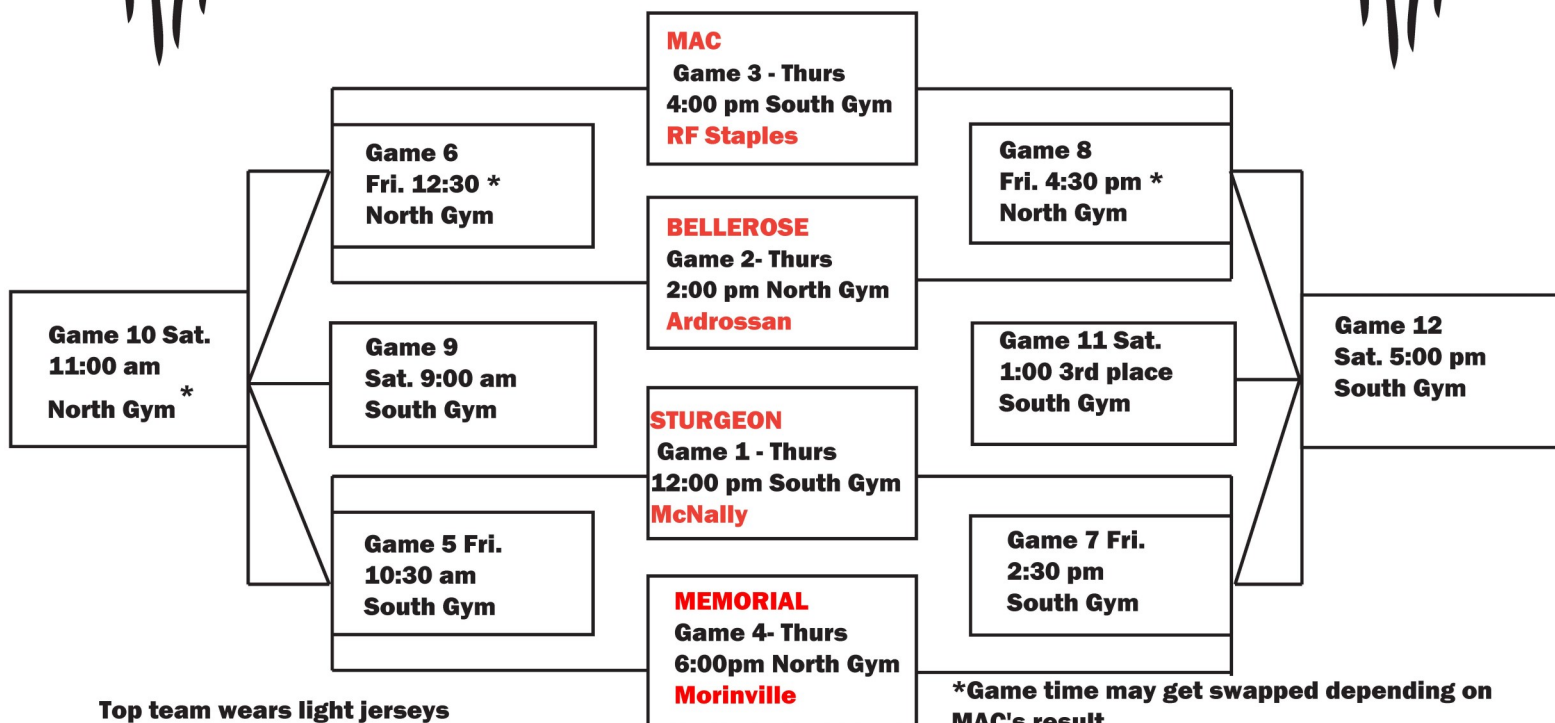

Login to myPass to:

3. **Get your Alberta Student Number (ASN number) from the school.**

To Sign up Online

- Go to myPass.alberta.ca.
- Click on the "Sign in with Education Account" to create account (Do not use school email address).
- Select I'm new, sign me up!"
- Alberta Education will then email you a confirmation link, that will then take you to a sign up page.
- **You must use your legal name.**
- Enter your **Alberta Student Number** and date of birth.
- You will be sent two things – an email with a URL and a physical letter with a 4 digit PIN. This PIN will expire so set up your account immediately.
- Once you have your PIN, click on the "Activate Connection" link in your email, and your myPass account will be created.
